
Gentlemen:

An enthusiastic group of our Senior High School students, with faculty and administrative sponsorship, have submitted a request to establish a non-commercial educational 10 watt FM radio broadcasting station.

They have made a feasibility study, determined license requirements of the FCC, have the services of a fully licensed engineer available, and are now seeking financial assistance. This office is attempting to assist them in this endeavor. I note in the FCC INF Bulletin No. 21-B, Sept. 1966, that the NAB provides consultation and distributes information to aid in the development of educational radio. Do you have any provision for making small grants (approximately \$700.00) for projects of this nature? If not, are there any sources other than FSEA, Title III which might be explored for this purpose?

From an administrative and educational point of view, we see such a project as an excellent opportunity in training students, at a high interest level, in communication skills and media. The objective to transmit educational, cultural, and entertaining programs for residents and pupils in the school district as envisioned by the students may readily be broadened to develop programs which could be transmitted to specific schools in the system for use in connection with regular courses.
